### What does the new social distancing rule actually mean?

From 4 July, people should either stay 2m apart or '1m plus' - which is one metre plus mitigations. These mitigations will depend on the workplace or setting. For example, on public transport, people must wear a face covering, as it is not always possible to stay 2m apart. In other spaces, mitigations could include installing screens, making sure people face away from each other, putting up hand washing facilities, minimising the amount of time you spend with people outside your household or bubble, and being outdoors.

Precautions such as

- Wearing a face covering
- Keeping interactions brief
- Following the COVID-19 Secure guidelines wherever you are
