

LICENSING ACT 2003

APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that an application for a Premises Licence under the above-mentioned legislation has been made by **Sibel Acinik** to Boston Borough Council in respect of premises known as **The Assembly Rooms** which are situated at **5 Fish Hill, Market Place, Boston, PE21 6NN**

The application applied for is to permit the following licensable activities during the given times

Sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on & off the premises and live Music

Sunday – Thursday: 08.00 hours until 03.00 hours the following day
Friday – Saturday: 08.00 hours until 04.00 hours the following day
24th & 31st December: From the start of permitted hours until the end of permitted hours the following day

One additional hour to the standard and non-standard timings upon the commencement of British Summertime

Recorded music, Performances of dance, Anything of a similar description

Sunday – Thursday: 08.00 hours until 03.30 hours the following day
Friday – Saturday: 08.00 hours until 04.30 hours the following day
24th & 31st December: From the start of permitted hours until the end of permitted hours the following day

One additional hour to the standard and non-standard timings upon the commencement of British Summertime

Late night refreshment

Sunday – Thursday: 08.00 hours until 03.30 hours the following day
Friday – Saturday: 08.00 hours until 04.30 hours the following day
24th & 31st December: 23.00 hours until 05.00 hours the following day

One additional hour to the standard and non-standard timings upon the commencement of British Summertime

The register of applications may be inspected at the offices of Licensing and Land Charges Section, Municipal Buildings, West Street, Boston, Lincolnshire, PE21 8QR, during normal office hours.

Any representations by responsible authorities or other persons regarding the application must be made in writing to the Licensing Authority, Boston Borough Council at the above address by **Wednesday 18th August 2021**.

It is an offence, liable on summary conviction to a fine up to Level 5 (£5000) on the standard scale, to knowingly or recklessly make a false statement in connection with the application.
